Because of a misspelling, a plaque scheduled to be unveiled at the James Farmer memorial was returned to the stonecutter in a rushed attempt to repair the error.

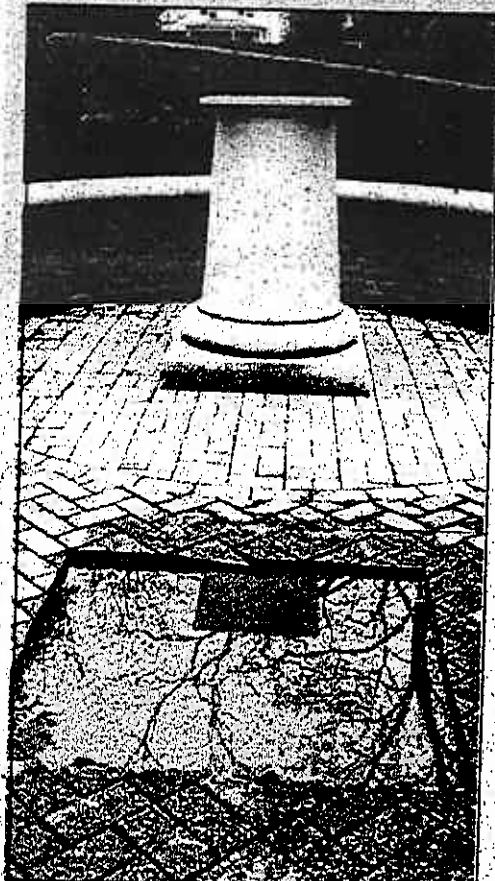
The word "presidential" was spelled "presidental." The plaque was placed in the ground by Facilities Services shortly after its arrival from the Richmond engraving firm Grappone and Sons. The James Farmer bust and memorial site are scheduled to be unveiled April 20 along with the James Farmer Distinguished

According to Ranny Corbin, executive assistant to the president, the unveiling will still go as planned.

"As soon as it was in the ground, we saw the error," Corbin said.

After the mistake was found, administrators contacted Grappone and Sons immediately, and the firm offered to flip the plaque over and engrave it again at no cost to the college.

"They were very apologetic," Corbin said. "[The mistake] could happen to anyone."
